THOMAS C. EVANS III APPOINTED DIRECTOR OF GPO'S OFFICE OF ELECTRONIC INFORMATION DISSEMINATION SERVICES

Thomas C. (T.C.) Evans III, a 20-year veteran of the Government Printing Office, has been named Director of GPO's Office of Electronic Information Dissemination Services. The appointment was effective January 14.

GPO's Office of Electronic Information Dissemination Services (OEIDS) is responsible for administering **GPO Access** (www.gpo.gov/gpoaccess), the award-winning online service of the Government Printing Office. Started in 1994, **GPO Access** now hosts or links to more than 200,000 Federal titles online. Traffic on the Web site now averages more than 26 million document retrievals per month, totaling 1.3 terabytes of data, the equivalent of 637 million typewritten pages.

Recent **GPO Access** highlights have included hosting the Supreme Court's *per curiam* opinions on the Florida election case as part of its ongoing responsibilities for the official Supreme Court Web site (www.supremecourtus.gov) and hosting the U.S. District Court's *Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order*, and *Final Judgment* in the Microsoft antitrust case.

Evans began his GPO career in 1981 as a Supply Systems Analyst in the Superintendent of Documents Technical Support Group and became head of the Documents Planning and Development Branch in 1988. In 1994, he

joined the Office of Electronic Information Dissemination Services and was named Assistant Director in 1996.

In making the appointment, Public Printer Michael F. DiMario said, "I have the highest confidence in T.C.'s experience with, and commitment to, expanding online public access to Government information resources through *GPO Access*."

Evans earned his B.S.B.A. degree at East Carolina University in 1979 and his M.B.A. at Marymount University in 1988. Evans resides in Frederick, MD, where he has served for several years on the Board of Directors of the Frederick Festival of the Arts, twice as president.
